

#### Minutes Tuesday, June 9, 2020 3:30pm-5:00pm, Zoom

The May 12 2020 minutes were approved.

Drs. Larry Hollier and Joseph Moerschbaecher had asked to address the Faculty Senate but were not able to attend due to unforeseen reasons.

President's Report –

- Regarding statements on racial unrest across the nation:
- A Group of students and faculty approached the Chancellor and the Dean of Medicine and felt that the first statement that the Chancellor sent out was not a strong enough statement regarding police brutality. The Chancellor then sent out a second statement that was endorsed by the AAMC (Association of American Medical Colleges) concerning police brutality. The Chancellor did not want many different statements coming from the different schools. This one statement was signed by all the deans of the different schools.
- Movement to Phase 2 return-to-work dependent on city/state guidance
  - Antibody testing will be offered to students, faculty and staff on a voluntary basis. If you have a reaction, you will be asked to see your PCP to see if the virus is active. If positive for the active virus you will have to selfquarantine for 14 days.
  - There will be large scale contact tracing also. There should be a Web based app available in the next few weeks.
- Construction has not stopped during the COVID Pandemic. It is still ongoing.
  - Boring into concrete of the CSRB will start this week
  - Scheduled noise and street closures. Bolivar is closed off so that the wiring on top of the walkway can be completed.
